

HOW DOES WISCONSIN'S NEW E-CYCLING LAW AFFECT YOU?

Effective September 1, 2010, many electronic items will no longer be eligible for incineration or disposal in landfills. The purpose of the law is to expand and encourage electronics recycling in the state of Wisconsin, making it much easier for homeowners and schools to recycle old electronics.



WHY RECYCLE ELECTRONICS?

There are many reasons to recycle electronics.

- Many electronics contain harmful materials such as mercury and other heavy metals and chemicals such as flame retardants.
- Toxic materials in electronics can leach into the environment, causing harm to the environment and human health.

Landfill and Incineration Bans

The following electronics will be banned from landfill or incinerator disposal as of September 1, 2010:

- Computers (desktop and laptop, including netbooks and tablet computers)
- Desktop printers (including those that scan, fax and/or copy)
- Computer monitors
- Televisions
- DVD players, VCRs and DVRs
- Fax machines
- Mice and keyboards
- Other computer accessories including hard drives, speakers, flash drives and modems
- Cell phones
