

**CITY OF PLYMOUTH
CHAPTER NO. 3 ORDINANCES OF 2010**

An Ordinance Amending Sections 13-1-109(a) and 13-1-105(d), and Creating Section 13-1-112 of the Municipal Code of the City of Plymouth Regarding Signs and Banners

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PLYMOUTH DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Upon recommendation of the Plan Commission and after a public hearing having been held thereof, Section 13-1-109 (a) of the Municipal Code of the City of Plymouth is hereby amended to read as follows:

(a) **Banner Sign Limitations.** In B-1, B-2, B-3 and CB Districts an annual permit may be applied for allowing the erection of one (1) banner per entrance facade [with a maximum of two (2) such entrance facade banners], at any given time as long as such banner is affixed or attached flat against the building facade no higher than the wall itself or twenty (20) feet, whichever is less. A permit therefore shall be valid on a calendar year basis, and require annual re-application. The duration of an individual banner placement shall be no more than 90 (ninety) consecutive days. Renewal and banner approval shall be at the discretion of the Zoning Administrator, and shall be based upon the applicant's previous history of proper banner maintenance. Permit issuance for a previous calendar year period shall not guarantee issuance for a renewal period.

SECTION 2: Upon recommendation of the Plan Commission and after a public hearing having been held thereof, Section 13-1-105(d) of the Municipal Code of the City of Plymouth is hereby amended to read as follows:

(d) **Painted Wall Signs.** Painted wall signs which are signs painted directly onto the surface of the building, except where specifically allowed as a conditional use by the Planning Commission.

SECTION 3: Upon recommendation of the Plan Commission and after a public hearing having been held thereof, Section 13-1-112 of the Municipal Code of the City of Plymouth is hereby created to read as follows:

SEC 13-1-112 PENALTY

Any person who shall violate any provision of PMC 13-1-102 through PMC 13-1-111 shall forfeit not more than \$25 for each violation, plus the costs of prosecution. Each day of continued violation shall constitute a separate offence subject to said penalty.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
